




LEGO Ideas - Help Amelia Earhart take Flight in Imagination

JMK Women in Business Scholarship 2016



The winner of the Zonta Clubs of Hamilton 1 & 2 JM Klausman Women in Business Award for 2016 is Ivana Lochhead, a student at the Schulich School at York University. Ivana is current in Madrid, Spain for 3 months as part of the Schulich School of Business exchange program. She considers herself an instigator of change, demonstrating strength in identifying and addressing structural and people issues within teams. She uses her personal drive and vision and experience in analytical and leadership roles to solve problems and provide creative solutions.

Her journey to find purpose and meaning in her professional life and her desire to learn and challenge herself led her to pursue her MBA at Schulich. In addition to her studies, she is spearheading a Women in Leadership initiative called #Manbassadors. This movement encourages male students to advocate for gender equality and women's empowerment and pro-

vides the Schulich community with a platform to discuss gender issues and dynamics in business, supporting the concepts of empathy, engagement and impact change. The initiative started at Harvard Business School in 2013 and has been adopted by other top-tier US schools such as Wharton and Ross. Schulich will be the first Canadian business school to join the movement.

One of her teachers describes her in this way: "Overall, Ivana exudes passion in everything she does. I have always believed she possesses the drive, hunger, intelligence and influence to be a successful leader in whatever she decides to do. She is a true class act."

Ivana has already received her cheque of \$1000.00 from the Zonta Clubs of Hamilton 1 & 2 and she would be happy to attend a dinner meeting when she returns from Madrid.
