International Activism & the Nobel Peace Prize

Dear All.

The 16 Days of Activism Tool Kit is now available on the 16 Days website. Go to www.16dayscwgl.rutgers.ed which will bring you to the home page for this year. Scroll down and click on the tool kit. You will find valuable information in the tool kit and be sure to read the opening letter which gives helpful advice on how to customize your program. The 16 Days of Activism is an appropriate way to advance the cause of ending violence against women and raising awareness in your communities. The smallest effort will be rewarded by increasing the visibility of your clubs as well. Please let me know of your efforts so that I may share them with our international community.

On another note, it was announced that three African women, among them President of Liberia, Ellen Johnson Sirleaf, were awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. The citation said, "We cannot achieve democracy and lasting peace in the world unless women obtain the same opportunities as men to influence developments at all levels of society." The other two recipients are peace activist Leymah Gbowee, also of Liberia, and Tawakul Karman of Yemen, a pro-democracy campaigner. The New York Times article (today, 7/10/11) reads "Most of the recipients in the award's 110 year history have been men, and Friday's decision seemed designed to give impetus to the fight for women's rights around the world."
