# Take Back the Night



Thursday September 12, 2013, SACHA hosted Take Back the Night in Hamilton. Take Back the Night was started in the United States in Philadelphia in October 1975. A young microbiologist, Susan Speeth was murdered by a stranger a block from her home while walking alone. This event has been called several different names but has always carried the same message. Women should be safe to walk the streets of their city at any time of day or night. Women world-wide have been marching to reclaim the streets to be safe and secure.
