The Fundraising Committee Needs YOU!

This year the major fundraiser for our Club will be the sale of lottery tickets for the Canadian Hard of Hearing Association House lottery.

Dianne Moore had a sign up sheet at the June meeting, and many members have signed up to sell tickets—for those who have not yet signed up, there will be a sheet at the September meeting or please contact Dianne directly. The goal is to have 3 Zonta shifts per week (with 2 Zontians working each shift) that may occur at Limeridge Mall or house during the daytime or evening. Tickets go on sale October 31st until January 6th.

For every ticket sold, our Club receives \$1 (whether sold by club members elsewhere or on the shifts). The Club also receives funds for every shift that members work at.

The Fundraising Committee's goal this year is \$4,000. With everyone's help, we can make it!
