The United Way Burlington & Greater Hamilton is undergoing some exciting changes to better understand and serve Burlington and Hamilton. As many know, United Way works to improve lives and build community by engaging individuals and mobilizing for collective action. Currently, the United Way BH is engaged in a community impact strategy project, called the *Road to Greater Impact* Strategy, to refine their work, better define their intended impact and begin a process of transition to a new, more impactful United Way to serve our future communities. United Way BH is currently conducting a comprehensive community engagement process and has asked the Zonta Club to be a part of it. United Way BH says this project is both exciting and challenging and it's going to take a community-wide effort to get it right.

Thanks to Renate Davidson and Jelaine Foster for representing our club with me.

Shirley Ellison, District Z and Golden Z club chairman, gave good advice to the club about connecting with Zonta International and other Golden Z clubs. Lori Robinson, chairman of Z and Golden Z clubs for Zonta International, gave greetings and words of encouragement from Zonta International through a Skype call.

The outgoing President Salwa and incoming President Ana spoke with enthusiasm about the struggles in keeping the club going and plans for expanding the presence of the Golden Z club at McMaster. They feel fortunate that they are in one of the few clubs that has a connection with an outside service club to use as a resource for activities at McMaster.





Advocacy

Here in Ontario some new initiatives have been introduced for victims of sexual assault. Daiene Vernile, MPP for Kitchener-Centre chaired the hearings which were held across Ontario.

- A test program of four free hours of legal advice will be rolled out in Toronto, Ottawa and Thunder Bay. This is not court time but it will give victims an idea of what working through the justice system entails. Eventually it may be available in other centres.
- Right now breaking a lease in Ontario requires 60 days notice but victims or parents of child victims will be able to do this with 28 days notice if they need 'to move to insure their physical safety'.
- Last year an advertising campaign began which encouraged individuals to 'intervene when witnessing sexual harassment' and be aware 'that they had an obligation to intervene if they witnessed sexual violence'.
- All 'universities, colleges and private career colleges' will be asked to develop strategies regarding how they deal with sexual violence, incidents and complaints.
- Employers will now need to be more aware also as sexual harassment is being included in the definition of workplace harassment.

We had a call from the Native Women's Emergency Shelter in March asking if we had any of our "wonderful toiletry bags" available. She wanted to have 50 of them, and right away if at all possible. Luckily Gertrud had a bit of time. She bought a few things, had some stock still at her house and so was able to make 15 of them, which she delivered the very next afternoon. They were thrilled!

However, now Gertrud is out of everything! For anyone travelling - we bring back the hotel size shampoo, soap, lotions and conditioners. We also need toothbrushes, toothpaste, facecloths, deodorants and other small toiletries. If you see something on sale, go ahead and pick it up, it will be used in the kits. Gertrud will store everything at her house so it can be brought to any Zonta meeting.

- ♦ The Finance Committee members who worked on dues, have agreed to go with the Board recommendation of an increase of \$10 per member, bringing the dues to \$185 per member and that for 2016/2017, the exchange difference will be absorbed by the administration reserves. This will be brought forward to the membership at the April dinner meeting for voting.
- A Hamilton 1 is contributing a raffle basket at the upcoming District Spring Workshop of approximately \$50. Given the short time period we decided to purchase a basket from Denninger's.
