


Communications Corner

October 2012 President's Report

Dear Zontians of Hamilton 1

I hope everyone has enjoyed a wonderful Thanksgiving and is enjoying this lovely autumn weather. This fall has been a busy time for us all, getting back to our regular Zonta dinner meetings and into our regular routines. We are looking forward to our joint dinner meeting with our sister club Hamilton 2 on Monday. I am confident

that we will enjoy the evening and the fellowship of our neighbouring Zonta sisters.

I am delighted to see that many of the committees are hard at work helping our club and our community. Now that we have our new bylaws in place, the board, in conjunction with all the committees, will be reviewing and editing our rules of procedures so we have an up-to-date document to assist members and committees in our duties. We will be finalizing the strategic goals so they are realistic, impactful and progressive. I look forward to further discussions with the membership and committees as to our progress.

I am going to put on my banker's hat for a minute and share with you something about our Canadian currency. It has been almost ten months now since the Bank of Canada has introduced our new \$50 bill. It is polymer and really quite beautiful. This bill is very durable and has many security features. The change presented a few challenges for counting machines, ATMs and merchants. In my opinion the change in the material has been well worth it. There is one other change in the \$50 bill that you might have heard about. As part of the redesign of the \$50 bill, an arctic research vessel has replaced the "Famous Five," who won full political rights for Canadian women in 1930.



The old \$50 note featured the five women whose case to have women included in the legal definition of "people" was successful at the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council of England - the highest court in Canada at the time. Emily Murphy, the British Empire's first female magistrate, and novelist and women's rights suffragist Nellie McClung were

members of the Famous Five.

According to the CBC, some have voiced disappointment at the design change. "It's particularly disturbing, saddening, frustrating... that the famous five or another group of identifiable Canadian women will not be on our currency," says Frances Wright, founder of the Famous Five Foundation. But Marjorie LeBreton, the Leader of the Government in the Senate, doesn't make much of it. "Some of these debates are so 70's," she said. "We've come so far beyond that."

I do believe we have come a long way - thanks to these ladies and others, like us Zontians. However I do think remembering our past helps us stay focused on our future. I have therefore chosen to put an old \$50 away for my daughter, so she can show her daughter someday.

Further Film Festival Information

Arise - A film that captures the portraits and stories of extraordinary women around the world who are coming together to heal the injustices against the earth, weaves together poetry, music, art and stunning scenery to create a hopeful and collective story that inspires us to work for the earth.

Saving Face - Every year in Pakistan, many people – mostly women – are victimized by brutal acid attacks. With little or no access to reconstructive surgery, survivors are physically and emotionally scarred. Many reported assailants, often a husband or someone else known by the victim, receive minimal if any punishment from the state.

The Price of Sex - A feature-length documentary about young Eastern European women who've been drawn into a netherworld of sex trafficking and abuse. Intimate, harrowing and revealing, it is a story told by the young women who were supposed to be silenced by shame, fear and violence.
