# October 2018 President's Report

I hope that you have all enjoyed a wonderful Thanksgiving weekend. The weather does remind us that Summer is a memory but beautiful crisp Fall days are still to come.

Looking forward to the Municipal Election, I hope that more women will be elected. I have also thought that Denise Christopherson's plea to City Council for integrating a "gender equity perspective" is a way in which more women would benefit from public spending and I will assess candidates with this in mind.

Disheartening events south of the border were offset by the news that PM Justin Trudeau has nominated Alberta-based judge, author and academic Sheilah Martin to the Supreme Court of Canada to fill the vacancy December 15th due to the retirement of Chief Justice Beverley McLachlan. Martin was first appointed as a judge in 2005, and served on the Court of Queen's Bench of Alberta in Calgary until June 2016, when she was appointed as a judge of the Courts of Appeal of Alberta, the Northwest Territories and Nunavut. Her 30-year legal career has focused on Indigenous issues, education, equality rights and increasing the number of historically underrepresented groups in law schools and the legal profession.



In support of ending child marriage, Zonta International President Susanne von Bassewitz made a statement at a high-level side event on eliminating child marriage in Africa at the United Nations General Assembly. "We are eager to explore how collaboration can come to life to end child marriage," President Susanne said. The event, organized by the permanent missions of Canada and Zambia to the United Nations, UNICEF, UNFPA and UN Women, engaged African Heads of State and governments in a dialogue on child, early and forced marriage with the goal of renewing commitments to implement national strategies to end child, early and forced marriage.

At the St. Joe's Mental Health Morning Fundraiser on October 2, Judy Ambrose, Sandra Cronk, Renate Davidson, Maureen Hayman, Kathy Kingsmill-Marsales, Nancy Zilvytis and a few friends – Donna Marcaccio, Maria Lio, Nina Ahuja and I shared a table and enjoyed Margaret Trudeau's candid story of living with bipolar disorder. Women 4 Change is also hosting a breakfast on November 26<sup>th</sup> to celebrate National Philanthropy Month and Zita Cobb, one of Canada's leading female philanthropists will speak.

Committees have been meeting and planning the year. The final (I hope) Committee List is attached to the October mailing. We will discuss our fundraising, especially the Golf Tournament with you at the October meeting. Please think about this in advance. We all enjoy being able to support deserving women and girls in our community, but we also need to support the immense work that goes into an event such as the Golf Tournament and not rely on the same group to continue to do this. Sandra Cronk and her team of wonderful women deserve to step away and take a turn at a supporting role. In Zonta we are stronger and more effective together.

The Program Committee has invited interesting speakers to our dinner meetings...Public Health Nurse Margot Corbin in October to talk on the Opioid Crisis in our city and in November Sgt. Sara Beck will talk about Human Trafficking. As always feel free to invite guests, friends, potential new members to have a Zonta "experience"!
