

May Dinner Meeting Reminder

Hamilton will mark its inaugural Menstrual Hygiene Day on May 28th with a gathering at Hamilton City Hall beginning at 10 a.m., featuring a keynote address by Councillor Maureen Wilson. United Way, which is running a Period Promise campaign in May to help end period poverty, will also mark Menstrual Hygiene Day in Gore Park from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Nearly 1 in 4 Canadian women has struggled to buy period products for themselves, or their children.

In support of this initiative, please bring a feminine hygiene product to the meeting and we will donate the products to the United Way campaign.



May 2019 President's Report



Dear Zonta Sisters,

Mother's Day has just passed. Although it was not a sunny warm day here, it is a celebration honouring the mother of the family, as well as motherhood, maternal bonds, and the influence of women in society. I hope all of you felt celebrated!

On the flipside, the news for the last few weeks has been full of remarks made by men, mostly politicians, that do not consider the rights of women as equal to those of men. The arguments go back and forth on social media and in the news and so it seems that we must ratchet up our influence on politicians and our advocacy for women and girls. Sadly gender disparity still exists and it affects many women and girls.

The findings in a recent IPSOS survey commissioned by Girl Guides of Canada, indicated that girls are still clustered in lower-paid "pink ghetto" jobs — for example babysitting, compared with yard work.

"While about 11 per cent of boys reported experiencing some form of sexual harassment or assault during their 2018 summer work, females appeared to be worse off. About 13 per cent of girls polled said they experienced some form of sexual harassment or assault at work, rising to 19 per cent among older teens and 23 per cent for girls from lower-income families.

The report offers advice for employers: scrutinize hiring practices to avoid bias, pay fairly and ensure the workplace is free of sexual harassment. Parents are urged to talk daughters about money and pay, encourage their girls to speak up at work, and support non-traditional choices.

It also urges girls to see their time as a valuable resource, to get comfortable talking about pay, and to know they have a right to feel safe at work." https://nationalpost.com/news/canada/summer-gigs-canadian-girls-typically-earn-less-than-boys-survey-suggests

I am attaching the email and information that was sent to the MPP Donna Skelly with regard to cGaming. It was also sent to MPP Andrea Horwath, MPP Paul Miller, MPP Monique Taylor and MPP Sandy Shaw. I have only received one response from Andrea Horwath, who wrote:

"New Democrats value the role that these centres play in supporting our local charities and believe that any modernization program should be rolled out responsibly and fairly.

Members of the Ontario NDP Caucus have already taken action on this issue by addressing it directly to the Minister of Finance, who oversees OLG and its programs. We will continue to actively press the government on this matter to ensure that our local bingo halls keep running, and no charities in Hamilton lose out on funding."

As a club we must continue to monitor laws and policies and their impact on women, participate in hearings and public meetings with local politicians and administrators, to raise awareness about significant issues still affecting women and girls in our local communities.

Menstrual Awareness

Period Promise (running May 1st – 28th) is an initiative started with United Way Lower Mainland on the West Coast (www.periodpromise.ca). This initiative builds on Tampon Tuesday - a menstrual hygiene awareness and product drive that United Way and Labour Community Services across the country have been running for years. The Period Promise has grown from that, as a greater need has been recognized in our communities. United Ways are stepping up to bring even bigger, more impactful initiatives forward around menstrual equity. In 2018, the Hamilton organization FemCare with the help of Councillor Maureen Wilson and community supporters, brought forward a motion for the City to begin providing free menstrual products. There is momentum in the community.

Period Promise includes a large product drive during the month of May. We'll also be screening the Oscar-winning documentary "Period, End of Sentence." at both Playhouse Cinema (Hamilton) and Film.ca (Oakville) to raise awareness. The product drive will culminate on May 28th, International Menstrual Hygiene Day at the Summer Promenade festival at Gore Park. We will be building the word PERIOD. out of the product and inviting the media, community agencies and corporate supporters – anyone can attend. Please do so if you have time to attend before our dinner meeting.
