November 2019 President's Report



During the Remembrance Day snowstorm, I listened to the first of the CBC Massey Lectures by Sally Armstrong entitled "Power Shift: The Longest Revolution". The podcast is available at the CBC and the book version is published by House of Anansi Press. It is an engaging and thought-provoking look at the need for the empowerment of women and girls in our world. She argues that gender inequality is costly and must be eliminated. "In many ways, it has never been a better time to be a woman: a fundamental shift has been taking place all around us, and we're all better off. Yet the promise of genuine equality still eludes half the world's population."

The 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence is a time to galvanize action to end violence against women and girls around the world. Locally, we as a club are taking a stand beginning on November 25th, when our banner will be up at City Hall. There are other actions that you can take individually. Through the Canadian Women's Foundation <u>https://www.canadianwomen.org/16-days-of-activism/</u> you've got 16 days to check six practical things off your list and make a big difference!

Please invite friends to join us for dinner on December 10th at Liuna Station in the King George South Ballroom on the Lower Level. December 10th is Human Rights Day and we will

welcome Dr. Beverly Jacobs. Dr. Jacobs, Mohawk Nation of the Haudenosaunee (Iroquois) Confederacy, Bear Clan, received the Zonta International Centennial Award for Canada. In addition, we will have a social time and entertainment provided by Singin' Women, a community choir established in January 2017 with a commitment to singing songs of justice with a particular focus on bringing awareness to the issue women's homelessness.

Zonta International has scheduled the next Zonta Talk for November 16th to discuss "Advocacy: Global to Local". Zonta clubs around the world will present their successful local advocacy activities and lessons learned. Participants will have an opportunity to ask questions and present their own examples live in an interactive session.

Alice Tyler and I have accepted the United Way invitation on November 21st for a tour of the MILLI exhibit at the AGH followed by a reception at 5:30pm. Lunafest 2019 Wrap-Up

Thank you to everyone who helped and came out to Lunafest on October 27th. Our new location, Playhouse Cinema, on Sherman North was well received, as were the movies. We had very positive feedback from those in attendance on this event.

We sold 101 tickets - down from 119 in 2018. However, we made almost the same as in 2018, thanks to lower expenses. Our rental cost of the Playhouse Cinema was 40% less than at Zoetic.

Revenue from tickets, basket raffle and 50/50 was \$2,890.00.

Expenses including cinema rental, fee to Lunafest, 50/50 payout and miscellaneous items was \$1,595.89. Our net profit was \$1294.11.
