April 2021 President's Report



"Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world".

It is said, educate a girl and we bring a new, intelligent, liberated and great moral power to the fate of mankind.

Zonta International has long supported women's dreams through our global educational programs and scholarships. Our club and individual support of these programs is making a difference to the education of females around the world. Access to education for girls and women is not just a global issue. In our own community many young women struggle to achieve the level of education they deserve and need, often due to financial constraints.

The Zonta Club of Hamilton 1 has made an impact on this front for years, offering scholarships and bursaries to young women so that they can pursue their education dream and change the world.

Take a moment to review and absorb the important support and service we offer.

Directly through our club, we offer the:

Young Women in Public Affairs – an annual award of \$750 to a student attending high school, college or university.

Jane M Klausman Women in Business Scholarship – an annual award of \$1,000 for a woman demonstrating outstanding potential in business-related fields in a university degree program.

Our reach goes far beyond the club awards. We also offer a number of named awards in cooperation with community partners and education partners. Our newest award is for an Indigenous graduating student from Bernie Custis Secondary School. With the onset of COVID-19, this award has not been given as of yet.

Through McMaster University:

The Zonta Club of Hamilton 1 Frances Colter Memorial Bursary – Since 2016, awarded by the School of Graduate Studies to students enrolled in the School of Rehabilitation Science Physiotherapy program who demonstrate financial need. Value of the award is approximately \$2000 annually.

The Zonta Club of Hamilton 1 MBA Bursary – Since 2006, this award is granted annually to a female student enrolled in the MBA program, who demonstrates financial need. Approximately \$1000 annually.

The Zonta Club of Hamilton 1 Bursaries – Since 1997, bursaries are granted annually to students who demonstrate financial need and are enrolled in Engineering, Business or Indigenous Studies. Approximately five students per year.

Through Mohawk College:

The Zonta Club of Hamilton 1 Awards – Since 1998, these awards are granted to students demonstrating financial need, with a minimum 80% average.

We also have *community based bursaries* that are awarded in our name:

Zonta Club of Hamilton 1 Crown Ward Bursary Fund (CAS of Hamilton) – established with a generous bequest from Helen Orban, this is awarded annually.

Olga Cloke Bursary at the YWCA – This bursary was established in 1971 and endowed in 1994 when Olga died, with family donations and contributions from our Club. The winner receives a \$750 bursary.

If you doubt the power of these bursaries, here are the words of Victoria Charron, the 2020 **Olga Cloke Bursary** winner. In her final year of Speech-Language Pathology program at McMaster, Victoria lost her job due to COVID-19, leaving her financially insecure. Victoria, who has worked at YWCA Hamilton's pool in the past and has volunteered for the Good Beginnings and Girl Space programs, says she was "humbled and grateful" to be chosen for the bursary. "It's been tough year for a lot of people since the pandemic hit," Victoria said. "Every little bit helps, especially when you're in school."

After she graduates, Victoria is considering several different avenues to focus her career. Among her interests is genderaffirming voice therapy, which helps those transitioning into a different gender to safely find a voice that is more suitable for their new identity. Cont'd p.4

Service Committee

The Service Committee's very difficult task in the past month involved reviewing the seven applications from community organizations for our Service Project Grant program. We received approval from the Club, at the Business Meeting on March 23rd, to allocate our 2020-2021 Service funds for the following four projects:

Putman Family YWCA: \$5000 from the Service Trust account. We will donate \$5000 for 2020-21, and a further \$5000 in the next year, to contribute towards outfitting this affordable, 'safe housing' residence and related programs for women and women-led families who come from marginalized groups and have experienced violence, homelessness, poverty and trauma. A contribution of \$10,000 allows our club to be a Founding Member of the Builder's Circle.

Willow's Place-Mission Services: \$4,000 from the Bingo account. This program provides a safe, low barrier, female-identified space for women which meets their immediate needs of daytime shelter, food, caring, compassionate support, community and access to showers and laundry. The staff provide referrals to meet housing, mental health and addiction recovery needs. This service, which was utilized by over 500 women in 2020, aligns with our club's service mandate.

Interval House Hamilton-Mentor Action program: \$4,000 from the Bingo account. This program, which includes the 'Be More Than a Bystander' program, provides supports to prevent gender-based violence through engaging male community leaders who challenge existing societal norms that perpetuate gender-based violence. They provide education focussing on healthy/unhealthy relationships for boys and male college students in sports teams and classrooms. Zonta funds will be used for promotion of the program, including educational posts, memotos for youth attendees at presentations, bus advertising, billboards.

Hamilton Music Collective: \$2,500 from the Service General account

The Hamilton Music Collectives' AIFEC (An Instrument for Every Child) is a non-profit organization which makes music programs available to children and teens in poverty situations. A particular emphasis for our funds would be to support the 'Music for Wellness' program. This program is designed to create a sense of belonging and connection, particularly for adolescent girls who are dealing with marked anxiety and isolation during the pandemic, helping them also to improve their emotion regulation and self-esteem.

The projects which were not selected this year include the United Way Halton and Hamilton, Women-focussed Initiatives; Living Rock Youth Resources, Wellness Works program; and the Cancer Assistance, Drive to Deliver program.

As well, we will make a special donation of \$1000 to the programs offered by the Sexual Assault Centre of Hamilton and Area, in recognition of the donations given in memory of Dorothy Cronk, Sandra's and Nancy's Mom, who was also a special friend to our Club.
